Junior Competition Chair

Rick Clift discussed some of the highlights and challenges in 2004-05, including:

- Increased participation in junior curling in all events. Timbits Elementary and Bantam Mixed were the only two events with declining numbers and Rick attributed the decline in numbers to scheduling conflicts that continue to be a challenge in junior curling.
- A lack of host sites for many of our junior events at the zone, regional and provincial level. This is becoming a serious issue and Rick issued a challenge to all clubs to step up and host events. Juniors are the future of curling in Ontario and we need to provide our junior curlers with the opportunity to display their talents on the ice.
- The format change (from 10-ends to 8-ends) of the Junior Mixed competition.

Rick thanked the many people that help make junior curling a success in Ontario, including the coaches, curlers, instructors, program organizers in the clubs, club and youth zone representatives, and the provincial organizing committees who did such a great job this past season.

In closing, Rick thanked the OCA staff for their help and assistance during the season.

- The excellent relationship the OCA established with Rogers TV. We now have the most extensive curling coverage of any provincial association in Canada. Jack thanked Doug and the office staff for their efforts in achieving this goal.
- The Competition Review Committee continues to work and once a formal report is completed, it will be submitted for approval, and acted upon by the Board.
- Jack announced a new title sponsor for the Men's Championship, the Kia Cup, as it is now known. We have an excellent relationship with Kia and Jack thanked them for their outstanding contribution.

Jack extended congratulations to the OCA provincial champions, and in closing, thanked the volunteers and OCA staff for their hard work and dedication.

As a result of our favourable financial position, \$150,000 was transferred to the Member Club Assistance Fund bringing the total to \$452,700. Rob is optimistic the OCA will continue to remain healthy thanks in part to the increase in sponsorships.

Rob extended special thanks to Doug and Shelley for doing their part in the achieving the results.

Rob moved the adoption of this report and the reappointment of PriceWaterhouseCooper, LLP, for this ensuring year.

Report from the Rules Committee

The OCA held its annual Rules Committee meeting on Saturday, May 28th, 2005, to review the suggestions and ideas that were submitted in writing to the OCA office this past season.

A copy of the Rules Supplement that will be tabled for use in the 2005-06 season was included in the binders, previously circulated for review. Also included were the Men's and Women's Challenge Round forms and guidelines, Exhibit 17 and 21 that have been changed for the 2005-06 season.

At the National Curling Congress held in Gatineau, Quebec, June 16-19th, no rule changes were announced for the coming season.

Allan thanked everyone who submitted rule suggestions in the past twelve months and recommended this process continue in the future. In 2004-05 we saw the implementation of the on-line entry process and the OCA hopes that it will become the preferred choice of teams entering competitions in the future. Allan thanked the Rules Committee for their time and effort and the OCA staff for their assistance this past season.

Allan highlighted changes made to the Rules Supplement as a result of deliberations made at the Workshop on June 25th as follows:

- ✓ **Page 4** under heading **Competition and Regulations**, Item 1, please amend wording to read: All competitions (including Challenge Round) are considered to have started the Friday immediately prior to the start date of the zone competition regardless of the actual starting date of the event.
- ✓ **Page 6** under **Alternates/Substitutions**, Item 2, Second Paragraph, the last sentence will now read: (Silver Tankard or Women's Tankard are allowed two (2) alternates/substitutes per double team entry).

JUNIOR COMPETITION REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2005-2006

The 2005-2006 curling season was a successful one for the Junior Curlers of Ontario, despite the ever present challenges that face these curlers in their pursuit of their love of the game. Very successful provincial championships were held in all our youth events and the Codey Maus Junior Men's rink brought home a Bronze medal from the Canadian Junior Curling Championships, held in Thunder Bay.

STATISTICS

The following chart compares the numbers of teams in the various OCA Youth competitions for the past three seasons:

As can be seen from this chart, only three events (Pepsi Junior Men and Junior Women and Timbits Elementary School) showed an overall increase in participation levels, while all the other youth events reported a drop in numbers of teams entering at zone play. A quick analysis of entries by zones shows no geographic pattern related to these reductions, as zones from the east to the west had less numbers of teams taking part in the various events. Scheduling issues may have been a significant contributing factor to the reductions in the various events this year, however, should this trend continue next season, a detailed analysis of why participation levels are dropping will have to be done.

On the positive side, the Timbits Elementary School Championships showed a significant increase in teams taking part. Hopefully many of these elementary school teams will bring their interest in competitive curling into the Bantam ranks over the next couple of years.

COMPETITION REVIEW

During this past season, there were no major changes introduced to the various youth competitions. The caliber of play at all of the junior curling events continues to improve dramatically. The shot making skills and the demonstrated understanding of the complexities of curling strategy even at our entry level events shows that our junior curlers are continuing to develop within the club system in Ontario.

ON LINE ENTRY SYSTEM

The 2005-2006 season saw an increase in the use of the OCA online entry system, as familiarity with this system increased across the OCA. The availability of the online system reduced the number of instances where teams missed zone entry deadlines, effectively making this a non-issue during the season.

LOOKING AHEAD

There are still two major issues facing youth curling for the future, the ongoing struggle to secure host sites for many of the OCA Youth curling events, particularly at Zone and Regional levels of play, and the lack of title sponsors for our Bantam Boys & Girls and Mixed championships. It is hoped that the success of the various provincial championships this past year will spur our member clubs into putting bids in to host the various youth events over the next few years. There are many opportunities for sponsorship of our Youth Events, and potential sponsors need to be identified and encouraged to get on board supporting youth curling in Ontario.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Finally, I would be very remiss if I didn't thank the many people in the curling community who have made this season the success it has been for youth curling in the OCA. Thanks go out to the coaches, instructors and program organizers at the clubs, the Club and Zone Youth Curling Reps, the Ice Techs who produced superb ice for all the youth events and the Provincial Championship organizing committees who did such a great job hosting the various provincial finals.

I would also like to extend a sincere thanks to the OCA Office staff for all their help and assistance during the season, looking after all the details associated with administering OCA youth curling.

GORE MUTUAL - ONTARIO SCHOOL CURLING FOR THE YEAR 2005-2006

Once again the Gore had a good year with entry numbers remaining fairly constant - 132 Boys' Teams and 104 Girls' Teams. There was some concern that the entries were down in a couple of zones, but this was compensated by increases in other areas. Several zones held their playdowns on weekdays instead of weekends, and reported that this saw an increase in their numbers, and avoided conflict with other competitions. Also, efforts by the OCA to avoid scheduling bantam, junior and school events during the exam period at the end of first semester were appreciated.

Fortunately, few issues arose this year. There was confusion in one case concerning who was designated to host a regional competition. As a result it was difficult to obtain ice at the last minute. Consequently, this year I confirmed the commitments with the convenors just before the spring symposiums. Each Zone was also reminded to confirm ice time at the same time. This year we have also had 3 Zone Convenors retire, and only have replacements for 2 of them at this time. The other issue which certainly caused concern for convenors was the default by 2 teams and last minute substitution. Finally, it was also necessary to remind students and parents that all team members must be enrolled in a school program at the time of the specific competition, e.g. "School Curling".

We also attempted to promote with our coaches at the zone meetings, the idea of a 'curling credit' at the high school level. This spring the OFSAA Women's Coaching School also held a Curling Clinic to support this idea.

The finals were hosted by the Simcoe Curling Club. The committee, under the leadership of Garry McMillan did a wonderful job and made it a memorable event for the competitors. Next year's finals will be hosted by Carleton Place and the 2008 competition will take place in Barrie.

The Academic Awards were won by Peter Stewart (Cameron Heights) and Nicole Weckman (St. Mary's HS) while the Kevin McArthur Sportsmanship Awards were won by Patrick Latulippe (Carleton Place HS) and Renee Lalonde (J. Clarke Richardson HS).

The competition results are on the attached page.

As in the past I think that the continued success of The Gore School Curling is very dependant on the close ties between the OCA Reps and the school system. I would like to thank both Doug and Marg for keeping me informed of all the issues arising and especially Howard Stanfield , the past Chair, for his support throughout the year.

Thanks primarily to Andy Wintonyk, the OCA webmaster, as the website continued to be informative and popular with curlers and curling fans as evidenced by the several million "hits" it received again this season.

Changes to the website, influenced by feedback from "our customers" included listing the entire team personnel of Provincial winning teams, as well as adding the current rules supplement to the rules page.

MEMBER CLUB ASSISTANCE FUND

This "potential support" to Ontario curling clubs was implemented this past season. At least one curling club has benefited from this program, with several others inquiring about it.

There will be three High Performance Camps in the coming year in Guelph, Oakville and Fort William.

LOOKING FORWARD

It is essential that the Ontario Curling Association and other appropriate "partners" find proactive methods and resources to assist Ontario curling clubs. Hopefully the planned Regional Symposium(s) will become a reality, however we cannot rely on only one approach to service the various needs of a large number of curling clubs in diverse communities.

It is also essential that the O.C.A. seriously consider finding more staff resources in order to implement these initiatives. The development of Ontario's curling clubs needs to be the primary responsibility of at least one part time staff member.

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2005-2006

As Director of Finance, I am pleased to submit, herewith, the audited financial statements of the Ontario Curling Association for the year ending May 31, 2006. As you can see, by the report, the Ontario Curling Association had an excess of revenues over expenses of \$21,307, a slight decrease from last year.

Once again because of our favorable financial position we were able to add \$125,000.00 to the Member Club Assistance Fund bringing our total to \$588,100. To date one loan has been disbursed with several other applications recently received.

Highlights from this years report include:

REVENUE

SPONSORSHIP - revenue is down approx. \$9,500 as the CCA Development Funding of \$19,000 was cut and the \$2,250 that was received is shown under the Grants section.

OTHER REVENUE - down by approx. \$11,400 due to lower ticket sales from men's championship

COMPETITION EXPENSES

TRAVEL - revenue up by approx. \$15,600 with nearly all (\$14,800) attributed to the increased cost to send the STOH teams to Fort Frances.

RECEPTIONS/OTHER - OCA expense for 2006 Kia Cup Guelph was costed to receptions category only this year versus 2005 Kia Cup Whitby where it was split between receptions and other

OFFICE & ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

OFFICE - mainly due to the cost of a temporary bookkeeper hired after resignation of staff member

MEETING & COMMITTEE EXPENSES

ACCOMMODATION - higher by approx. \$6,500 due to increased AGM expenses (Gananoque vs. Midland)

CONCLUSION:

Thanks to our Member Clubs and Corporate Sponsors, we have had a successful year.

At this time, I'd like to thank all the staff for their hard work and support during the past season. Special thanks to Doug and Shelley for their part in achieving the results that we have before us today.

I would like to move the adoption of this report and the re-appointment of our auditors, PriceWaterhouseCoopers LLP for the ensuing year.

1 The organization

The Ontario Curling Association (OCA) is a provincial organization operating programs and providing support to curlers to promote the sport of curling in the Province of Ontario.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

Financial statement presentation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations published by The Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants, using the restricted fund method of reporting restricted contributions.

The financial statements include the following funds:

- Operating fund - accounts for the association's program delivery, support services and administrative activities, and includes the cumulative, unrestricted net excess of operating revenue over expenditure.
- Invested in equipment - includes funds that have been used for the purpose of purchasing equipment, net of accumulated amortization and financing costs.
- Member club assistance fund - established to provide limited financial assistance to curling clubs that encounter a temporary financial problem, which requires urgent funding. The association will make loans to member clubs on such basis from time to time. Interest earned on cash available in the fund will be reinvested into the fund.
- Special event fund - includes a specific donation designated for a particular purpose by the donor.

Use of estimates

The financial statements have been prepared from the records of the association, on the basis of established accounting methods and the judgements used by the association in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. Actual results could differ from estimates made by management.

Revenue and expense recognition

All revenues and expenses are recognized on an accrual basis.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of liquid investments such as term deposits and money market instruments, with maturities of 90 days or less, carried at market value.

Equipment

Equipment is recorded at cost. Amortization is calculated using the straight-line method over a three-year period except for the costs of leasehold improvements, which are amortized over the term of the lease.

Deferred revenue

Revenue of the operating fund is deferred when it is intended to fund expenditures in future periods.

Fair value of financial instruments

The fair value of financial instruments is determined by reference to various market data and other valuation techniques, as appropriate. The fair values of financial instruments approximate their recorded values, except as disclosed elsewhere in the financial statements.

Contributed services

The association is dependent on the ongoing support of volunteers. Given the difficulty of determining their fair value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

6 Member club assistance fund

The operations committee, as authorized by the Board of Directors, approved a transfer from the operating fund to the member club assistance fund during the year ended May 31, 2006 of \$nil (2005 - \$150,000).

The association entered into a loan agreement with a curling club for an amount of \$15,515 on March 29, 2006 bearing interest at prime rate less 100 basis points. The loan is repayable in five equal annual payments of \$3,103 plus interest commencing December 1, 2006.

7 Special event fund

A donation of \$100,000 was received in a prior year from the family of Joe Todd Sr. These funds are to be used for special events as approved by the executive committee and have been set aside in a special event fund.

8 Operating lease commitments

The association leases its office space for a base annual rent of \$22,686 expiring November 30, 2009.

The association also leases office equipment for \$1,453 per month expiring May 30, 2011.

ZONE RE-ALIGNMENT REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2005-2006

A committee consisting of Judy Weaver, Katherine Johnston, Tom Moran, John Scott, Steve McDermot, and myself was asked to have a look at possible changes to the existing zone structure in the OCA jurisdiction. The last time this topic was examined, was in 1995/96. The committee along with Doug Bakes met on September 19th in Ingersoll. Some of the changes the committee considered were:

- Zone 2 - add North Grenville Curling Club (New Club)
- Zone 3 - add Almonte Curling Club (from zone 2)
- Zone 8 - add Milton Curling Club (from zone 9)
- Zone 9 - add Cookstown Curling Club (from zone 10)
perhaps add Bradford & Dist. C.C. (from zone 10)
- Zone 11 - add Kincardine Curling Club (from zone 14)
add Durham Curling Club (from zone 14)
add Hanover Curling Club (from zone 14)
add Markdale Country Club (from zone 9)
- Zone 14 - add Stratford Country Club (from zone 15)
add Tavistock Curling Club (from zone 15)
add Arthur & Area Curling Club (from zone 12)

The committee recommends that these changes be discussed with the curling clubs first, followed by discussions at the fall zone meetings. The input from the clubs and the zone meetings would be reviewed by the OCA Executive and final recommendations completed before the spring zone meetings. The clubs that are being asked to change to different zones would then attend the spring zone meetings in their "new" zone.

REPORT ON THE 2006 NATIONAL CURLING CONGRESS AND CANADIAN CURLING ASSOCIATION AGM

Allan Brunt and I attended the 2006 National Curling Congress and CCA Annual Meeting in Gatineau, Quebec June 14-18, 2006 as voting delegates. Rick Clift, Jim Campbell and Doug Bakes attended as observers.

The keynote address was given by Jim Carroll - an expert in trends and innovation. Although he is a C.A. by trade, he was funny, unique and full of fascinating, quirky, yet serious thoughts. His presentation examined the trends that will impact curling in the years to come, and the challenges and opportunities that will present themselves. He suggested that curling focus on opportunities that are presenting themselves. In his mind, with the population aging but wanting to remain active, baby boomers are a major target market for associations and clubs.

Concurrent sessions were held for the National Technical Committee, Technical Coordinators and Master Course Conductors. Gerry Peckham let us know that the group was working on an Intermediate training program focusing on those curlers that have been playing for a couple of years. He also outlined the various funding programs available to our elite and upcoming elite athletes including Own the Podium, LaReleve and the Athlete Assistance Program.

Voting Delegates/Board of Directors Meeting - Wednesday 8:00 p.m.

An interesting and at times heated conversation took place among the Member Association voting delegates and the CCA Board of Directors. The focus was on the current governance model, specifically the role of the CCA Board of Directors, the CCA staff and the Member Associations. The question of Board accountability was raised, and it was agreed that while the Board is accountable to the MAs, it is responsible to a much larger group, including sponsors, TV broadcasters, etc. It was agreed that this would be a major topic for discussion for the week.

CCA signs 6 year deal with TSN

On Thursday, June 15, the grand announcement was made outlining the 6 year broadcast agreement between the CCA and TSN. This agreement begins after the 2007/2008 curling season which is when the current CBC agreement expires. The new agreement will see the return of the broadcast morning draws, and will mean 240 hours of live coverage a season, 280 hours during Olympic seasons with the curling trials.

Round table and other discussions

Danny Lamoureux organized several very interesting sessions throughout the week.

- Manitoba has introduced a credit course on curling in their schools. This is a credit program that takes place over 4 years and includes levels 1 and 2 coaching, levels 1 and 2 ice making, club management, Business of Curling, as well as strategy and skills development.
- Malik Abdelmalik from the Canmet Energy Technology Centre spoke on a program (Refrigeration Action Program) that is successful in the conservation of energy as well as the reduction of costs. This program targets hockey rinks, shopping centres and curling clubs. These are energy intensive buildings because of their refrigeration requirements. They have developed the "Cool Solution" which allows the maximum recovery of heat from the refrigeration unit that can be used for other purposes in the building. New Liskeard C.C. is part of a pilot project to use the expended energy from their equipment in other parts of the club. Danny will be developing a curling club survey to determine energy usage and potential areas for savings
- Chris Daw, Canadian Paralympic Gold medalist, spoke on wheelchair curling. He indicated that there are 1.6 million Canadians with disabilities, and that 66% of this group are looking for an active lifestyle. Curling is unique among sports for these people because there is no requirement for a special wheelchair. He also said that 20,000 people a year become disabled.
- Glenn van Gulik, CCA's Information Technology specialist, made a presentation on TechSoup, the Technology spot for non-profit organizations. TechSoup Stock connects nonprofits with donated and discounted technology products from 25 providers including Cisco and Microsoft. The OCA Board will discuss the products available through this website, and how best to subscribe to the services it offers on behalf of its member clubs.

- Heather Mair, Assistant Professor of Recreation and Leisure Studies at the University of Waterloo, gave an update on her ongoing study on curling clubs and their impact on the community, especially in smaller communities. Her research will continue this year in Ontario, Quebec and the Maritime provinces.
- A representative from True Sport, a Canadian society that celebrates the core positive values of sport such as respect, honesty, fair play, discipline, commitment, and effort made a presentation on the organization and its goals. This group believes in the power and potential of sport, including the belief that children are more likely to participate in amateur sports if their

parents do. It is a growing Canadian movement that recognizes and promotes the life skills and values derived from community sport, and awards financial awards to communities and organizations.

- Where have the Business Women curlers gone? This session was run by Brian Cowan and Mort Cooper and looked at why the numbers of Business Women (BW) at curling clubs has fallen. A number of suggestions came out from across the country:
 - plan byes into the BW schedule as this will allow people to book vacations, plan meetings, etc and reduces their feeling of being committed to every week without a break
 - do an informal survey of your BW members (new and longer term) to discover what they like about the club, and what frustrates them (ice conditions, food offered, etc).
 - adjust start times to accommodate those coming from work and wanting to eat first or those that must go home first to organize their family
 - do follow-ups (exit interviews) to determine why a member left, and would they consider coming back the following season; keep in touch with this person throughout the season to let them know they are missed in the club.
- Why are the numbers of teams participating in playdowns going down? This discussion included the reluctance of teams to play against high performance elite teams, the intimidation of club teams by the elite teams, the "parachuting" of 4 good players from different clubs into one team, and the perceived "value" of a team's entry fee.

We also had emotional presentations from Wendy Morgan, Canadian Paralympic Team Leader and Chris Daw, Canadian Paralympic Gold Medalist recapping their experiences in Torino and the ultimate performance of Team Canada. We all got to touch a Paralympic gold medal, and to experience the emotion of hearing the Canadian national anthem being played as our flag was raised!

Following this, Jim Waite, Canadian Men's Curling Team Leader, gave us the inside scoop of the Olympic Games and Canada's 2 curling medals. It was a very exciting and emotional time for all of our athletes.

Annual General Meeting

At the CCA AGM on Sunday, Janie Hobart from the Northwest Territories and Jack Bowman from B.C. were elected as Directors to the CCA Board. The new President is Donna Duffett and Al Forsythe is now the Vice President.

Motions brought forward from the business session were as follows:

Beginning with the 2007/2008 Championship Season the Canadian Curling Association will ensure that the audit of each "Event Managed Property" is conducted by an auditor(s) who is/are independent and arms-length from the CCA auditor. The auditor will be selected after a tender process has been completed.

Motion defeated

That the CCA provide the levels of funding in the amount of \$5,000 to be paid to the Rogers and Potter teams who competed in the World Senior Championships in Denmark. These funds should be forwarded through the respective MA's in cases where teams were reimbursed from those associations.

Motion carried

That the CCA continue the practice of budgeting and forwarding the CCA support grants to the Member Associations as presented to, and accepted by, the Member Associations at the June 2005 CCA AGM. The amount of future CCA support grants will remain equal to or greater than the amounts presented to the membership in June of 2005.

Motion defeated

That the CCA work with the Member Associations to determine whether a clothing partnership that includes the use of a designated clothing supplier at the provincial level and also allows for the sharing of partnership revenue is viable. In the event this potential partnership cannot be completed by July 1st of 2006 it is agreed CCA staff and MA Executive Directors will work together to determine further potential for the 2007/2008 season prior to April 1st of 2007.

Motion withdrawn

That any funding requested by Affiliate Member Associations be endorsed by the respective Member Association in their jurisdiction (paraphrased).

Motion carried

That the President and Vice President be elected annually by the outgoing Board of Directors (paraphrased).

Motion carried

That the CCA tender for independent audit services every 5 years, effective for the 2007-2008 fiscal year, and that the ad hoc tender committee be comprised of one member of the Audit and Finance Committee, one senior staff resource and two members chosen by the Member Associations.

Motion carried

That a new or updated governance and organizational model be developed and presented to the 2007 NCC and 2007 AGM for review and approval and further that:

1. A joint working committee on governance and organization be appointed consisting of:
 - 4 members appointed by and from the Member Associations
 - 4 members appointed by and from the CCA Board of Directors
2. The responsibilities and mandate of the committee includes:
 - A) the responsibility to organize and develop a process for governance and organizational review
 - B) to engage a fully qualified and experienced facilitator in "policy governance" to assist the committee in developing the review process and developing recommendations for the 2007 NCC and AGM meetings
 - C) that the Member Associations and CCA staff be utilized as "resource" support to the joint working committee
 - D) it was acknowledged that the Member Associations would be developing a cost sharing agreement for their representation on the Committee

REPORT ON THE CURL ONTARIO WORKSHOP AND ANNUAL MEETING - JUNE 10, 2006

The Annual General Meeting and Workshop of Curl Ontario was held on Saturday June 10, 2006 at the Best Western Toronto Airport West Hotel in Mississauga. Vice President, Michele Gower, and Director of Development, Barry Macklin represented the Ontario Curling Association as voting delegates. Ontario Curling Association General Manager/Executive Director, Doug Bakes attended as an observer, as did Danny Lamoureux, Manager of Development, for the Canadian Curling Association. The meeting was chaired by Brian Cowan, Chair-Elect of Curl Ontario.

Highlights of the various Reports presented at the meeting included:

The Financial Report presented by the Director of Finance showed that Curl Ontario had a balance of \$7,960 excess of revenues over expenses for the year ending on April 30, 2006, a total of \$146,996 in net assets under administration, and a total liabilities and net assets of \$522,494 according to the auditors McCluggage & Smith Chartered Accountants.

The Report of the Chair-Elect presented by Brian Cowan indicated that the main initiative of Curl Ontario changed from establishing a "Centre of Excellence" to finding a better way to provide its excellent programs and services to ALL geographic locations in the province of Ontario.

The Report of the Director North presented by Dr. Clyde Opaleychuk stated that the priority of the four Curling Associations in the "North" was to continue to work towards the establishment of a Northern Ontario Curling Federation. It was also reported that Netta Calvert has resigned as President of the Northwestern Ontario Curling Association, and has been replaced by Rob Sinclair.

The Report of the Director South presented by Kathy Ryan stated that the re-design of the Curl Ontario website had been put on hold pending a possible change in the structure of Curl Ontario.

The Report of the High Performance Coaches Jim Waite and Wendy Morgan stated that the Trillium Camp (192 curlers) and for the first time ever the Amethyst Camp (96 curlers with a wait list) were filled to capacity. The "Coaching in Curling" Seminar held in Guelph in late April was excellent, an unqualified success, and attracted 120 coaches (30 others were on a waiting list). A total of 20 teams participated in the two High Performance Camps held in Guelph and Oakville. A total of approx. 23 Ontario curlers are participants in Sport Canada's La Releve

Program. A total of 8 Ontario curlers participated in Sport Ontario's Active 2010 program.

The Report on Wheelchair Curling from Leader Tom Ward stated that there are 54 regular active wheelchair curlers in Ontario participating in 8 different areas of Ontario. There was a total of 51 people, who participated in 3 curling clinics, and a total of 76 curlers who participated in 2 curling bonspiels. Twelve curlers competed in the both the Paralympics Ontario Winter Championships, and the Ontario Wheelchair Championships

The Report of the Provincial Development Co-ordinator, Linda Corcoran stated that a total of 452 people participated in 31 different courses for coaches/instructors, officials, and ice technicians. A Little Rock Resource Manual was developed and one manual was given to each curling club in Ontario. Grants were also received to assist in the development of "Curling for Seniors", whereby interested curling clubs each received a delivery stick, and will be given the opportunity to participate in one of eight qualifying bonspiels leading to an Ontario Championship. The Curl Ontario Course Calendar for 2006 - 2007 lists a total of 27 learning opportunities for volunteer coaches, instructors, officials, and 2 opportunities for ice technicians.

The Report of the Chief Executive Officer, John McCrae expressed both his appreciation for the excellent work done by Curl Ontario staff and instructors, as well as his frustration at the lack of nominations Curl Ontario receives for their various awards, and the lack of communication and action on some important Curl Ontario initiatives. This influenced the presentation of a Discussion Paper on the future of Curl Ontario, and another possible organization and method to deliver development programs and services in Ontario.

A motion was unanimously approved which directed Curl Ontario to investigate the changing of Curl Ontario to a Sports Council, and to develop a plan, by March 31, 2007, to repatriate the assets, programs, services on an equitable basis to each of the Northern Ontario Curling Federation, and the Ontario Curling Association.
