He announced that there were High Performance Clinics in Oakville & Thunder Bay and new clinics are planned for Guelph and Ottawa. He closed his remarks by highlighting the new structure of Curl Ontario

REPORT ON THE NATIONAL CURLING CONFERENCE & CCA ANNUAL MEETING

Larry Snow commented on the National Curling Conference and the changes that the CCA staff managed with the passing of Sandra Schmirler. He spoke about the discussions held concerning the possibility of holding the Annual Meeting at the NCC. He spoke about the various Notices of Motion, Finance, WCF, Development in Scotland, Danny Lamoureux's presentations & the CCA Development Fund. He announced the results of the elections and congratulated Fred Temple on his election to the CCA Board of Directors.

Larry then reported on the CCA Annual Meeting highlighting the Notices of Motion, including the date of age eligibility, investigating a 16 & under championship, amalgamated affiliation fees, and the timing of the Annual Meeting. He discussed changes in exclusivity payments where the less fortunate associations will get more. He touched on changes to the rules making note of the length of time for the extra end and the calling of timeouts. Larry announced that there had been a Scott Paper presentation and if all associations sign the agreement by the deadline, each will receive \$10,000.00

Jim Sharples spoke about a national Masters indicating that the CCA is not sanctioning such an event because they require a sponsor. He said the CCA shows a large surplus so this doesn't make sense and there are a large numbers of curlers in this age group. He asked the CCA to seriously look at this matter. Katherine Johnston advised that this was an accumulated surplus and was not the amount earned in one year. Fred Temple advised that it costs a minimum of \$100,000 to put on such a national champ and they are investigating a junior competition. Jim expressed concern that there is an over emphasis on junior curling. It is his opinion but he thinks the juniors are burning out because they are starting too early. Tom Moran advised that not all provinces have Master curlers and not all provinces have been paying the way for their teams to the Canadian Open Masters, a couple of teams had to pay their own way.

REPORT ON THE CANADIAN JUNIORS

Allan Brunt highlighted Gail Todd's report & did not read it at this time. He mentioned that the Junior girls finished with an 8-4 record and the boys finished with a 9-3 record. The boys lost a tie-breaker to get into the playoff round. This was the first year that random drug testing was instituted at the Juniors and one of the Ontario boys was picked. He said that Russ Howard spoke at the awards banquet and that Tyler Morgan had been selected to the 2nd All Star team. The 2001 Canadian Juniors will be held in St. Catharines and members of the host committee were in attendance and have advised that they are in good shape.

Larry Snow mentioned that he had spoken to the boy's coach at a presentation in Burlington and that it was Tyler Morgan who had been picked to provide a sample for drug testing and that it took 45 minutes. He said he told the coach to advise Tyler that in time it would be no problem.

GREETINGS FROM THE CCA

Katherine Johnston brought greetings and mentioned the new Ontario Board member, Fred Temple. She indicated that she is going to enjoy working with the new President, Zivan Saper, Vice-President Les Harrison and the staff. Katherine thanked the OCA for their support. She advised that she would be the Co-chair of Finance.

Fred Temple then spoke and mentioned that he was the new guy on the block and had only attended one CCA Board meeting. He spoke about a meeting he had attended in Winnipeg to change management policies of the CCA and that the organization was first rate. He looked forward to working with the Board and staff of the CCA.

GREETING FROM THE OLCA

Patricia Graham-Roberts brought greetings from the OLCA and spoke about the history of the OCA.

GREETINGS FROM CURL ONTARIO

Fran Todd brought greetings from the Board of Directors of Curl Ontario. She reported on the new organizational structure and discussed the role of Pat Reid and Jim Waite. She also advised the appointment of Susan Bean and Tom Coulterman as Regional Assistants in the Northwest and North, respectively. She closed her remarks by indicating that Curl Ontario was looking forward to working with the new OCA.

Cec thanked Jim Sharples for his assistance with the Curl Ontario proposed By-laws.

AMALGAMATION

Larry Snow advised that the amalgamation and transition process had taken two years to complete and he mentioned the package each Executive member had received outlining the outcome of all the meetings. He advised that this package was not very different than the last package. He confirmed that the clubs have ratified the amalgamation with 181 clubs voting yes, 3 voting no and 28 clubs not responding. He highlighted the various meetings that had produced what was thought to be an effective structure.

He advised that there will be 38 voting members. There will be a Board & Executive and that gender equality was a priority. Larry advised who would be considered honorary members and that they will have no vote but will be invited to attend meetings. Larry introduced the staff, advised where the office will be located. He thanked the members of the transition team for their hard work and asked everyone for support in the upcoming year.

Jim Sharples then explained the components of the motion to be made with respect to amalgamation and read the motion as follows:

WHEREAS it is deemed desirable for the Ontario Curling Association (OCA) to amalgamate with the Ontario Ladies Curling Association (OLCA).

AND WHEREAS the OCA is an Association not an incorporated body.

AND WHEREAS for such amalgamation to take place the OCA must have corporate status.
AND WHEREAS it is proposed that a new corporation be incorporated under the laws of the Province of Ontario in the name of Ontario Curling Association (New OCA) with the following objects:

- a) to promote the game of curling and to preserve its traditions;
- b) to promote good sportsmanship and the enjoyment of the game of curling;
- c) to promote and foster a competitive yet friendly spirit among those participating in the game of curling;
- d) to approve, arrange and govern competitions among those engaged in the game of curling, both male and female, in the Province of Ontario;
- e) to accept donations, gifts, legacies and bequests and to raise other funds with which to carry out its purposes;
- f) to provide financial and other assistance to curling clubs to enable them to carry out activities consistent with the objects of the Corporation.

to which OCA shall transfer all of its assets and which corporation shall thereafter amalgamate with the OLCA.

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved as a special resolution that;

1. Lawrence Allan Snow, John Duncan Sinclair McCrae and Joseph Thomas Moran be requested and authorized to apply to the Province of Ontario for incorporation of New OCA and that as directors and members thereof they be authorized to take all necessary procedures to activate the said corporate body and to enter into an amalgamation agreement with OLCA generally in the form attached hereto subject to such changes as they may determine.
2. That OCA transfer all of its assets to the New OCA on receiving assurances that the New OCA will forthwith thereafter enter into the said amalgamation agreement.
3. That the President and Secretary of the current OCA be authorized to execute all documents and conveyances as may be required to carry out the foregoing transfer and also to execute any Consent as to the use of the name that may be required to incorporate New OCA.

Art Lobel asked if Southern Ontario had to be identified in the objects. Jim indicated that this might be a problem because of the Scott Tournament of Hearts but indicated that they may be able to change the objects to make it clearer. He said he would think about it and discuss it with the other lawyer working on the amalgamation with him.

John Jefferson asked if there could be any tax implications and John Francis said no. John Jefferson asked about profits and John Francis explained that reasonable profits are allowed in a not-for-profit corporation because retained surplus is needed to operate.

NEW BUSINESS

Bill Baker expressed concern that the status of regional associations has changed and that they are unclear of their status. He advised that his member clubs have asked him approach the OCA about combining the OCA and TCA ice meetings. Larry explained that they decided to model the new OCA in a manner similar to the CCA where affiliated associations are not voting members. In the past the regional associations being voting members provided a means of getting an extra vote for their clubs and this was not available to all areas within the OCA jurisdiction. He indicated that the regional associations would still be invited to attend meetings and some of their members may be invited to be part of various committees. He suggested that the OCA would work with them to see where they want to be. Harry Clark asked if there would be the same communication flow and Larry confirmed that there would be.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Larry Snow advised that Honourary Life memberships will be conferred on Mac White & Norm Pyper and that the presentations would be made at a later date at the Burlington Golf & Country Club.

He then announced that the winner of the Tent Card draw is Andrew James Halliday of Arthur Area Curling Club who will receive 2 full week passes to the Nokia Brier with hotel accommodations courtesy of Choice Hotels Canada Inc.

PRESENTATIONS TO RETIRING EXECUTIVES

Larry Snow presented plaques to retiring executives and to Ice Team member Dave Merklinger. Dave indicated that he would still be available by phone to help OCA member clubs even though he is moving to British Columbia. Certificates were then presented to the regional association Presidents.

PRESENTATION TO OUTGOING PAST PRESIDENT

Larry mentioned the history of Phil's involvement in the OCA. He spoke of Phil's losing his wife Kathryn but continuing to attend meetings and do his job. Larry then presented Phil with an Honourary Life membership certificate and with a framed print.

Phil thanked the OCA indicating that it was his pleasure to be part of the OCA for the past 15 years. He said he was sorry that Kathryn was not here. He said that amalgamation was now complete and the organization has made wonderful progress and admonished everyone to keep things in a positive light and it will be great. He advised that he may be retiring but offered his help. He closed by thanking everyone for all of the friendships he has made over the years.

PRESENTATION TO PAST PRESIDENT

Tom Moran indicated that the last Past President pin was being presented to Larry Snow for diligent work over the last year. He commented on his dedication and drive towards amalgamation saying that Larry went above and beyond.

CLOSING REMARKS

Larry said that this was the end of the old but the beginning of a new, stronger and more effective association. He indicated that the past year had been tiring, demanding, but fun. He said that the OCA is blessed with a dedicated & sincere group of volunteers who have provided great support. He spoke about the blending of the volunteer base and advised that it was as difficult for him to see people not moving on to the new OCA as it is for them.

He stressed that without the staff at the OCA, we would not be the greatest association and thanked them for their commitment to their duties and the extra hours they put into their work.

Larry closed by saying that he is looking forward to working with new Board and challenged everyone to make the new OCA the envy of Canada and the world.

FUTURE MEETINGS

The next Annual Meeting of the Ontario Curling Association will be held June 17, 2001 at a location to be determined.

REPORT OF THE WOMEN'S COMPETITION CHAIR FOR THE YEAR 2000-2001

As the year 2000 – 2001 is the year of the volunteer, I would like to thank all of our Club Representatives, Zone Representatives, Regional Co-ordinators and Officials for all of their hard work. This past year, without your help, the running of our events wouldn't have been possible.

In our first year of Transition things have gone fairly smoothly and although we had a few bumps along the way, things turned out well.

As most of you are aware we have changed the format for the Hearts playdowns. There will no longer be a Southern Final. Zone playdowns will remain with 2 winners advancing to the regional playdowns. At the regional playdowns we will be using a Triple Knockout format, running it over 4 days with 1 winner from each region advancing to the Ontario Scott Tournament of Hearts. The Scott Hearts Challenge will remain the same with 1 winner from the East and West advancing to the Ontario final.

There seems to be a **PROBLEM** as our numbers are down in certain areas drastically from last year as shown in the following chart:

Senior Women	- down 17
Hearts	- down 6
Mixed	- up 6
Senior Mixed	- up 2
Women's Tankard	- up 4
Diamond Seniors	- down 7
Intermediate Women	- down 10
Trophy	- down 23

I would say that with Trophy & Intermediates, it was the timing. If you were to compete in these 2 events, it would have meant possibly 5 to 6 weekends away from home in a ten-week period. As the majority of these competitors are either wives, mothers and working this could be a problem. After looking at the schedule for the upcoming year, there seems to be a change made and we should see our numbers increase in these areas.

We are also looking at restructuring these events. Perhaps changing the format for the final of Trophy and also raising the age back to 40 for Intermediates might solve the entry problems for these events. We are finding that many of the Senior Women are still working and most of the zone playdowns have changed and are now held on the weekend. We hope that change will result in an increase in participants. We have a new event starting this year called the "Best Western Challenge". This event will be geared towards our "Grass Roots" curlers and structured along the lines of the men's Holiday Inn Challenge.

All in all Ontario had a very successful year, with 3 teams qualifying for the Olympic Trials including the Sherry Middaugh rink. We also won 1 Canadian Championship with the Anne Dunn rink bringing home the Canadian Senior Women's crown.

Many thanks to all of our office staff for their many hours of hard work because without your help and knowledge many things wouldn't be possible.

FOR THE YEAR 2000-2001**

This past year was a busy won for youth curling in Ontario with entries up in most events as the following chart shows:

For the two teams that advanced to the Canadian Junior Championships, it was a first-time experience. Carrie Lindner's team lost the semi-final game to PEI, the eventual winners. Bobby Reid's team record was 6-6. Phil Sager, who played second on Bobby Reid's team, was presented with the CBC Joan Meade award, given for athletic and academic achievement and volunteerism.

Various items of mutual interest and concern were discussed at the Junior Reps' meeting:

- Time-out rule
 - Big issue at the coaches' meeting
 - Gerry Peckham is getting feedback from players, coaches and officials.
- Canadian Bantam Championship
 - Junior Reps did not endorse this
 - Regional competitions were held this year in the Atlantic provinces (sanctioned by the participating associations) and Western provinces (not sanctioned).
- Decreasing number of entries in competitions
- Some provinces are focusing on recreational curling at the youth level.

In Ontario, the calibre of play at the Junior level was excellent, and the behaviour on and off ice was exemplary. Spectators, club members and hotel staff have been very complimentary about Junior and Bantam curlers.

Some issues have been raised throughout the year and at zone meetings regarding youth events:

All-Star Teams

As some junior teams become more competitive, they are inclined to form teams with other players of equal commitment and leave the junior program at their club. They focus on practices, and play in adult leagues. Although this may help to improve the skills of the team, the club junior program suffers.

Fifth (or fourth) end breaks

At youth events, the fifth end break is now held out in the ice area on the backboards. This has raised a new problem of food and beverages being brought out to the ice surface and the danger of spillage. It may be necessary to educate the players, coaches and parents, and to restrict what may be brought out to the players during the break.

Calendar

The OCA schedule is driven by the CCA Season of Champions and the CCA, in turn, are controlled by television. Next season, the Olympics are added to the mix. The Provincial Juniors will be held just 2 weeks prior to the Canadian Championships in order to avoid high school exams. University schedules will start to play a larger role in Ontario as students will be entering one year earlier.

Time-outs

The new rule implemented by the CCA states that a time-out must be called from the ice surface, but a coach may signal to the team to request a time-out. Gerry Peckham of the CCA is getting feedback, but the rule will be in place next season. Accessing the ice surface when the play is at the away end is another issue that needs clarification.

Hog Line Violations and length of games are issues not restricted to juniors but have been brought up on several occasions.

REPORT OF THE GORE MUTUAL SCHOOL CURLING COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR 2000-2001

Again this year, the competition was a frustrating one. With the labour (political) situation across the province, we received fewer entries this year. The entries for the boy's competition dropped from 135 last year to 92. The girl's entries dropped to 53 from the previous year's 62. It remains to be seen whether this situation will be resolved for next season.

There was evidence of good news along with the bad. Firstly, in half our zones, the number of entries in girl's competitions either increased or remained the same. Secondly, there were more non-teaching coaches at the final this year than in other years. This must mean that there were more non-teaching coaches involved in the competition than in previous years. This is encouraging because this is probably the direction we should be moving no matter what happens on the labour front. The Ontario School Curling Committee, the Ontario Curling Association through its Zone Junior Co-ordinators and local curling clubs should work together to get more schools involved in curling.

We had an excellent final hosted by the Exeter Curling Club. The support by the community was wonderful, including the volunteers who worked in the kitchen, the billets hosting teams, the scorers, the corporate sponsors who contributed either through donations or by buying ads in the program and the number of spectators who came out for each draw. This was all co-ordinated by Janice Shore and her committee.

At the meeting of the Ontario School Curling Committee, it was decided that for next year, all games in this competition would be eight ends.

Gore Mutual Insurance Company and Barry Kennedy must be recognized for the continued support given to school curling in Ontario. In addition, thanks should go to Gail Todd for acting as head official and to Marian Dupont for helping with zone playdowns.

The 2000-2001 curling season has been completed and once again it has been a successful year for the Ontario Curling Association. Teams that represented us at the Canadian Championships do so at a very high level, both on and off the ice. Particular mention should be made to Wayne Middaugh's rink, which finished third at the Nokia Brier in Ottawa and also qualified for the Olympic Trials along with the John Morris rink as well as Axel Larsen's rink, which finished in third spot at the Canadian Seniors.

In the past year, I had the pleasure of attending numerous zone playdowns, regional playdowns and provincial championships. At all levels of our game, the calibre of curling continues to improve. This is evident particularly in our youth curling and I believe it is due to the excellent coaches who have been trained by the Curl Ontario programs.

It should be said that great curling requires great ice. In Ontario we continue to lead in this area and a large thank you should go to Shorty Jenkins and his Colio Ice Team.

In the area of competition entries, things are not as good. As you can tell by the following chart, we are experiencing a serious decline in numerous events.

Some of this may be due to the fact that Ontario hosted three Canadian Championships this year. With the Scott Tournament of Hearts, Nokia Brier and Karcher Canadian Juniors available, curlers may have neglected competitions to see the best in the country showcase their skills.

I feel that we need to press our Club Representatives to get the message out to the curlers. We start this procedure by getting the word to them at the spring and fall zone meetings. The large number of people that have been attending our spring symposiums is perhaps the first indication that the message is getting out but we need to strengthen that. Our Zone Representatives have to get out to the clubs to support the Club Representatives as much as possible and perhaps should be looking at meetings during the course of the season. This could be at a centrally located club, which is hosting a zone playdown. All we require is a more hands-on approach to ensure greater participation in our competitions.

This past year produced some minor problems but on the whole, things went reasonably well. With the doubling up of our events this year (e.g. Colts and Trophy), I feel both our clubs and the association will benefit.

I look forward to working with the present and future members of the OCA during the next year and in closing, I would like to thank John McCrae, Doug Bakes, Cec Wintonyk, Terri Collicott and Dave (the slave) Hutchison for their support during the year.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT FOR THE YEAR 2000-2001

The past year has been an active one in the area of promotion and development with the following being a summary of the programs delivered:

International Plowing Match: The OCA had a booth at the International Plowing Match held near Elora last September. With the exception of the final day, the weather co-operated and the attendance was very good. Thanks to all the OCA volunteers who assisted in the booth handing out brochures, flyers and ballots for the draw. The OCA with assistance from the OVCA is planning to have a booth at the 2001 International Plowing Match to be held near Navan, September 18th to 22nd.

Spring Symposiums: The decision was made to hold three sessions at the Spring Symposiums this season: the Zone Meeting, the Technical session and the Ice Maintenance session. Special thanks to Pat O. Reid, Curl Ontario's Development Coordinator, for organizing and leading the Technical session at each symposium and to the Ice Team members who shared their expertise with the club Ice Technicians.

At the Zone Meeting, many clubs shared success stories of being able to secure funding for their clubs through the CCA Development Fund, the Ontario Trillium Foundation or the Community Super Build Fund.

Business of Curling Programs: Three Phase 1 Business of Curling sessions were held in the fall and two clubs have participated in the Phase 2.

Newsletter: After some delay, the first newsletter of the amalgamated association was distributed to the clubs at the spring symposiums. Extra copies will be available to the clubs in September and we are planning at least three newsletters next season.

Web Site: Our web site took on a new and updated look this season. We thank Andy Wintonyk, our Webmaster for the many hours spent re-designing and updating our site to make it more user friendly. Several areas will be completed during the summer.

Bonspiel Calendar: The Bonspiel Calendar was produced and distributed to our clubs in September. The calendar can also be found on our web site and since clubs were able to place their bonspiels on our web site themselves, it grew from 600 bonspiels on the calendar to over 1,000 bonspiels on our web site.

Tent Cards: Three promotional tent cards were produced and distributed to the clubs for display in November, January and February. We thank the Club Representatives for assisting us in getting this promotional piece displayed at the clubs. Thanks also to our new sponsor, Best Western Hotels for their financial assistance in producing the tent cards.

Colio Ice Team: We wish to thank the Ice Team consisting of Shorty Jenkins, Gord Carroll, Joe Hahn, Dave Carruthers and Dan Prohaszka for being presenters at the Spring Symposiums and their ongoing efforts assisting the Club Ice Technicians during the season.

Athlete Development: The OCA assists in promoting the Trillium Junior Curling Camps and the High Performance Camp held at the Guelph Curling Club each August. The programs are developed and delivered by Curl Ontario under the direction of Jim Waite, Ontario's High Performance Coach.

Sponsorships: The OCA had three new sponsors this past season, Best Western Hotels replacing Comfort Inns, Mike's Hard Lemonade and TIM-BR Mart. Scott Paper increased its sponsorship of the provincial Scott Tournament of Hearts this past season. The Inukshuk Marketing Group hired by the OCA to generate revenue opportunities on our behalf secured the TIM-BR Mart sponsorship.

Awards: Through Curl Ontario, OCA curlers and partners have the opportunity to win Ontario Sport Awards. The 1999 Ontario Sports Awards held at the Skydome in September 2000 with the following receiving awards:

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE FOR THE YEAR 2000-2001

I am pleased to submit herewith the audited financial statements of the Ontario Curling Association for the year ended May 31, 2001. The current 2001 numbers reflect the first year of the combined Ladies' (14 months from April 1, 2000) and Men's (12 months) operations. Comparative 2000 figures are the old OCA (Men's 12 months) numbers. The opening operating fund balance has been increased by \$124,000 to reflect the amalgamation of the OLCA's net assets at its last fiscal year-end March 31, 2000. Also attached is last year's proposed budget 2000/2001 for the combined operations together with the actual OLCA and OCA comparative year-ends.

The OCA reports a modest excess of revenues over expenses for the year of \$14,000. This helped maintain a reasonable operating fund balance of \$259,000 at year-end, which in turn approximates 29% of the Association's annual expenditures.

I wish to thank our dedicated management team and staff – John, Doug, Cec, Terri and Dave for their ongoing support and diligence in helping maintain a balanced budget.

Highlights from this year's activities include:

- We currently have earmarked and set aside approximately \$22,000 of deferred promotion and development funds for projects of merit.
- In the past CCA club sheet assessment fees (\$38/sheet per association) were received and paid in equal amounts. Last year we paid the CCA at the combined rate of \$76 however only charged our clubs \$50 per sheet resulting in a shortfall of \$23,000. Next year a new rate of \$61 per sheet will be charged by the CCA to associations that have amalgamated and we may consider collecting a like amount from the clubs to breakeven again.
- Sponsorship revenue increased by over \$33,000 however this amount was offset by \$29,000 paid to an independent marketing company for consulting and contract services in obtaining new sponsorships. We will continue to monitor this arrangement to ensure we receive good value.
- As an amalgamated association 27 competitions were organized and run during the past year. Direct competition and sponsorship expenses exceeded entry fees and sponsorship revenue by \$53,000, which means approximately 12% of the membership fees, was required to fund this shortfall. A responsible goal in the coming years will be to reduce this deficit funding to breakeven.
- During the year several qualified programs were supported by grants of \$21,000 (2000 - \$18,000) from the Ontario government via Curl Ontario submissions.

I would like to move the adoption of this report and the re-appointment of our auditors, PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP for the ensuing year.

1 The organization

The Ontario Curling Association (OCA) is a provincial organization operating programs and providing support to curlers to promote the sport of curling in the Province of Ontario.

On September 27, 2001, the OCA and the Ontario Ladies' Curling Association (OLCA) were amalgamated. The amalgamation has been accounted for like a pooling of interests. Operations of the OLCA have been included in the statement of operations from April 1, 2000 through May 31, 2001. Unrestricted operating funds of the OLCA as at April 1, 2001 in the amount of \$124,153 have been included in the statement of changes in fund balances for the year ended May 31, 2001.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

Financial statement presentation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations published by The Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants, using the restricted fund method of reporting restricted contributions.

The financial statements include the following funds:

- Operating fund - accounts for the association's program delivery, support services and administrative activities, and includes the cumulative, unrestricted net excess of operating revenue over expenditure.
- Invested in capital assets - includes funds which have been used for the purpose of purchasing capital assets, net of accumulated amortization and financing costs.
- Special event fund - includes a specific donation designated for a particular purpose by the donor.

Use of estimates

The financial statements have been prepared from the records of the association, on the basis of established accounting methods and the judgements used by the association in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. Actual results could differ from estimates made by management.

Revenue and expense recognition

All revenues and expenses are recognized on an accrual basis.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of liquid investments such as term deposits and money market instruments, with maturities of ninety days or less, carried at market value.

Capital assets

Capital assets are recorded at cost. Amortization is calculated using the straight-line method over a three-year period except for the costs of leasehold improvements, which are amortized over the term of the lease.

Deferred revenue

Revenue of the operating fund is deferred when it is intended to fund expenditures in future periods.

Fair value of financial instruments

The fair value of financial instruments is determined by reference to various market data and other valuation techniques, as appropriate. The fair value of financial instruments approximates their recorded values, except as disclosed elsewhere in the financial statements.

Contributed services

The association is dependent on the ongoing support of volunteers. Given the difficulty of determining their fair value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

**REPORT ON THE 2001 NATIONAL CURLING CONGRESS
AND CANADIAN CURLING ASSOCIATION AGM**

On Saturday February 17, 2001 the Provincial/Territorial Presidents' and Vice Presidents' meeting commenced at 3:00 p.m. A report covering the items reviewed will be issued under separate cover by the recording secretary and the CCA office.

SUNDAY FEBRUARY 18, 2001

President Zivan Saper welcomed everyone to the meeting and called for introductions.

The candidates for election to the CCA board were introduced and made their presentations.

Male candidates: Barry Greenberg, Manitoba, Curly Everitt, Northern Ontario, Gordon Granchelli, Nova Scotia and Eric Jamieson, BC

Female candidate: Diane Barker, BC

The items discussed at the Presidents / Vice Presidents meeting on Sunday were presented by Northern Ontario President Trevor Tilson, for comment by the CCA Board and Staff.

Juvenile Championship: The Board was asked to comment on the status of a sanctioned / funded national Juvenile Championship. Warren Hansen indicated that a review was completed and the costs involved would be same as the Seniors and that there would be problems securing a host site.

Junior Competition Dates: The concern of the member associations was that the date of the juniors was causing conflicts with school exams. Warren Hansen said that the dates of the Juniors / Seniors and Mixed were flexible, however, if the decision was made to move the junior event to another date the sponsor, who is currently happy, would pull their money and the event would lose television exposure. It was also noted that we currently have 7 hours of amateur junior sport on network television, which no other organization can attest to.

Retained Earning beyond \$1,000,000.00: It was requested that a provision be made for retained earning exceeding \$1,000,000.00 be returned to member associations in one form or another. This request resulted in discussion and many issues were rolled in i.e.: business plan, new building, hall of fame, and auditor's recommendations. This issue was summarized by stating that the surplus would not exceed the \$1M mark, at least for the next 5 years and further review would be carried out then.

Time out for Juniors: It was indicated that the current rule was not being well received by coaches. Gerry Peckham responded by saying that at last years AGM it was agreed that this new rule would be tried for a 2-year period and revisited at that time.

Hall of Fame: Various funding and location issues are being reviewed. It was suggested that assessments to each association could be considered.

Canadian Open Masters: Warren Hansen indicated once again that the costs to operate a sanctioned event would be equal to that of the seniors (\$120,000.00) and that a sponsor was not in the works. The member associations requested that consideration be given to any type of monetary assistance. If this were to happen it would not likely be until the surplus exceeded \$1M.

PAGE system for all events: The CCA will investigate the possibility of considering this playoff format for the Seniors next year, however, for the Juniors there are issues with the number of teams and TV, therefore a change is not expected.

Off-ice dress code: The rules have not changed. The teams are to look the same but they do not have to wear suits.

Change the age requirement for Canada Winter Games event: It was argued that the current age is what it should be.

Coaching qualifications: Concern expressed was that the Nova Scotia team had a coach with on ice privileges without level 2 and it could be argued that the decision to allow this was eroding the NCCP. It was explained by Gerry Peckham that a decision had been made to allow the team Sports Psychologist on ice privileges because he was there to perform the same duties as a coach and that his academic qualifications were at least equivalent to those of the NCCP. This rule will be modified and sent to member associations for comment.

Tickets for team followers: Blocks of tickets have always been made available for teams attending national events. This year at the Brier there is a problem. Warren Hansen explained that this would only be a one-time problem.

Transportation issues at the NCC: The member associations once again questioned the lack of organized funded transportation for the delegates. A motion was made requesting that transportation be provided at the 2002 NCC. (This motion was ruled out of order because the cost factors were not identified as part of the motion)

Many of these issues will be raised again throughout the next curling season and will be discussed again in 2002.

Finance Report:

Pat Ray advised that the CCA had a spot audit on January 2, 2001 by Sport Canada. Several recommendations were made, most of them housekeeping. The area of recording funding received from Sport Canada was the only major item. The recommended change will affect the bottom line of the 2001 budget by \$40,000.00 (negatively). This method of accounting will be changed for the future.

A review of the budget was made with no questions.

KEYNOTE ADDRESS:

The theme of the 2001 NCC was Volunteers. The keynote address was geared to this topic particularly as it related to teamwork and communication. Following the address everyone was divided into groups and participated in 4 modules relative to communication and teamwork.

MONDAY FEBRUARY 19, 2001

The morning session covered the definition of the various types of boards " advisory / governance ", what the responsibilities were of each, concerns related to each, problem solving techniques and volunteer recruitment. This session was facilitated by Ms. Toby Rabinowitz which involved both lecture and group work.

The afternoon session covered volunteer screening and was very heavy, however, the facilitator Ms. Linda Graff was excellent and had the entire group on the edge of their seats for the entire time. It certainly is my recommendation that this area be visited, however, it would be prudent to wait until the CCA model is developed. The reason is that the member associations would be creating a layered system, which could work in their favour in the event of a problem.

CANADIAN OPEN MASTERS MEETING

A brief meeting was held at the end of the day and was chaired by Jerry Shoemaker of Saskatchewan. The following items were discussed: cost sharing (this will be in effect for 2001 however not in 2002), site location (to be discussed again at the 2002 NCC). The 2002 site Medicine Hat will be confirmed by July 1, 2001.

TUESDAY FEBRUARY 20, 2001

Toby Robinowitz facilitated a lecture / break out session on volunteer recruitment and recognition. All of the materials received will be packaged and provided to the OCA board for their review and use.

Danny Lamoureux facilitated a review of the CCA development fund program. Changes will be made and the package will be forwarded to all clubs immediately following this congress.

Dave Parkes made a presentation on the Future Stars Program.

A presentation was made by Tom Moran on the Special Olympics Program at the Nokia Cup in Woodstock.

WEDNESDAY FEBRUARY 21, 2001

President Zivan Saper conducted a brief review of the week's activities regarding official business prior to closing the congress.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The election of the 2 new CCA board members was carried out. The elected persons were Barry Greenberg, Manitoba (first ballot) and Diane Barker, BC (acclaimed).

The various staff and Board liaisons that had attended the various events or meetings highlighted Championship, Awards and Scholarships, Development and Technical reports.

President Zivan Saper indicated that his report would be issued at the completion of this term in June.

All motions brought forward were moved, seconded and carried.

- 1) Draft budget
- 2) Housekeeping - amend the constitution to allow for proper proxy voting
- 3) Amalgamation of the Quebec Curling Associations into one to be known as Curling Quebec
- 4) Amalgamation of the Northern Alberta Curling Association, the Southern Alberta Curling Association, the Peace Curling Association and the Alberta Curling Federation into one organization conditional upon submission of satisfactory evidence confirming their reorganization on or before the 1st of October, 2001.
- 5) CCA to provide information on the cost of travel for delegates while in attendance at the NCC/AGM.

The Board of Directors of Hamilton and Area Curling Association requested affiliation with the CCA. This motion was moved and seconded (by others) and carried.

The AGM was adjourned.

REPORT ON THE CURL ONTARIO WORKSHOP & ANNUAL MEETING JUNE 2 & 3, 2001

In attendance, in addition to the Board Members, were representatives from NOCA, NOLCA, T&NOCA, NWOCA, NWOLCA, OCA, and Staff members, John McCrae, Jim Waite, Pat Reid, and Cec Wintonyk. Fran Todd, Curl Ontario Chair, chaired the meetings. The OCA was represented by Kathy Ryan and Tom Moran.

At the Workshop session held on Saturday, Board member, Brian Cowan, outlined success stories in the applications for CCA Development Fund and Trillium funding. Development funding now includes capital grants of 50% of the costs, up to a maximum of \$ 8,000. It is necessary to put forth the effort to outline the details in the application. It was emphasized that it would be beneficial to talk to organizations that have been successful. This information is available on the Internet.

The Trillium grants require a great deal of preparation in the application and can cover such items as new roofs, curling stones, new chillers, etc. and the Trillium Foundation will provide a program manager to work with clubs in preparing the application. It is important to note that the project cannot be started prior to receiving acceptance from the Trillium Foundation. More information, including a list of approved grants, can be found on the Internet at www.trilliumfoundation.org or by calling the Curl Ontario office. A presentation was made by a member of the Ministry of Culture, Tourism and Recreation on grant applications and she stated that last year \$94,000 was given to Curl Ontario. There are currently 55 sports eligible for grants and this year only 49 sports have made application.

Nearly 100 clubs have taken Level 1 in the Business of Curling - some for a second time. It was pointed out that OCA clubs are not as active as those in the north in participating in the Business of Curling, and they asked that clubs be encouraged to avail themselves of this help. There is a need for more course conductors for the "Business of Curling" especially in the south and associations were asked to identify people who could, or would, be willing to fill this role, and pass those names on to Pat Reid.

The Nokia Junior Stars program is now in existence and information will be available shortly through Curl Ontario.

A presentation was made on a Team Leader Concept, for teams going to National Championships. As a pilot project, this would be applicable to Junior Men and Women for this coming season. The team leader would be in addition to, or instead of, the Junior Representative of the Association. There would be no cost to the Association, as it would be funded by Curl Ontario.

High Performance Camps are extremely successful with waiting lists in some areas. The Trillium Camp is full with 50 applicants on the waiting list and the Amethyst Camp is likely going to have 70 campers this year.

There is a serious lack of certified coaches, especially in the south, and everyone was urged to promote coaching clinics at Zone Meetings. The theory component is now available via correspondence.

Curl Ontario is very actively promoting regional competitions as a prelude to a Juvenile Boys & Girls National Championship. These regional competitions would be for those 17 years old and under as of Dec. 31st. The only cost to Associations for the 2002 event would be travel and uniforms. The Optimists and the Host Committees provide meals and accommodations. The dates for this year's regional competition to include Ontario and the western provinces will be March 28th to April 1st, 2002.

At the Annual Meeting held on Sunday, the various reports were highlighted. Fran Todd, Chair, highlighted a few of the activities of Curl Ontario and advised the group of the status of the various awards for which nominations had been made. Brian Cowan, Director South spoke briefly about some of the items he had touched on during the Saturday session, as did Jim Waite, High Performance Coach.

Dick Henderson, Chair-Elect, indicated that he thought that we should be moving towards complete electronic communication for all clubs and associations but conceded that this might take time. The Director North, Jan Pula, reported on the success of the Scott Tournament of Hearts in Sudbury, and stated that there were 2800 students in attendance during the week.

Pat Reid advised the meeting that 1/3 of all curling coaches in Canada are from Ontario. She also reported on the success of the All-Ontario Bantam Mixed Championships in Sudbury. Curl Ontario was in a position to pay for the accommodation of the Bantam Curlers in Sudbury as well as the accommodations for the Junior Men and Women championships in the north and south thanks to the grant money received from the government.

A draft Business Plan for Curl Ontario for 2001 to 2005 was presented by Fran Todd, and adopted and the Team Leader Concept was approved although it still remains in the hands of the associations to decide if this will replace the Junior Representative or become an add-on.

Bill Charlebois from Thunder Bay was acclaimed as the new Director North replacing Jan Pula and will serve for a two-year term.

The Meeting closed with emphasis on efforts to improve communication to associations and clubs. The meeting adjourned at 10:20 a.m. June 3rd, with next year's meeting scheduled for June 1st and 2nd, 2002.
